Learn about the Indigenous People and their interaction with the European settlers, visit with a working blacksmith, explore frontier cabins, learn from candle makers, spinners and weavers, and about 18th century medicine. And discover the important role the environment... the river, the forests, the soil... played in the life of these early settlers.
